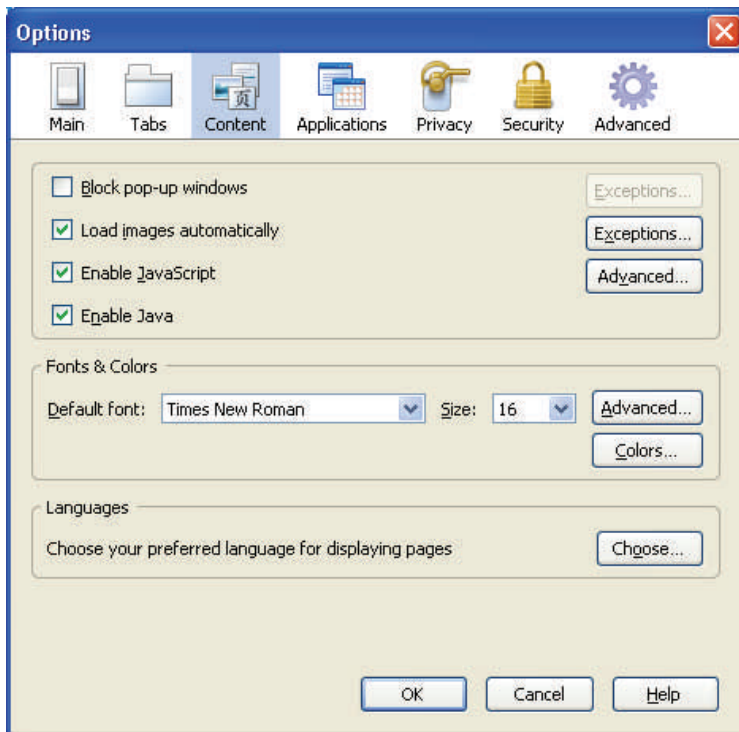
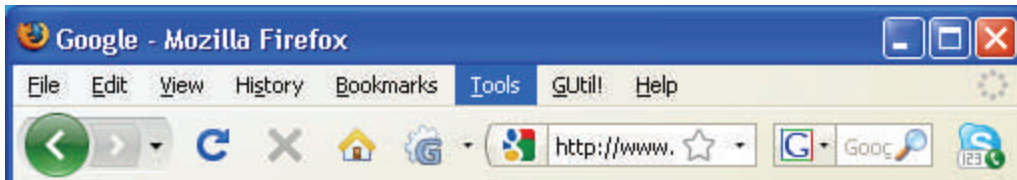

Changing website font size

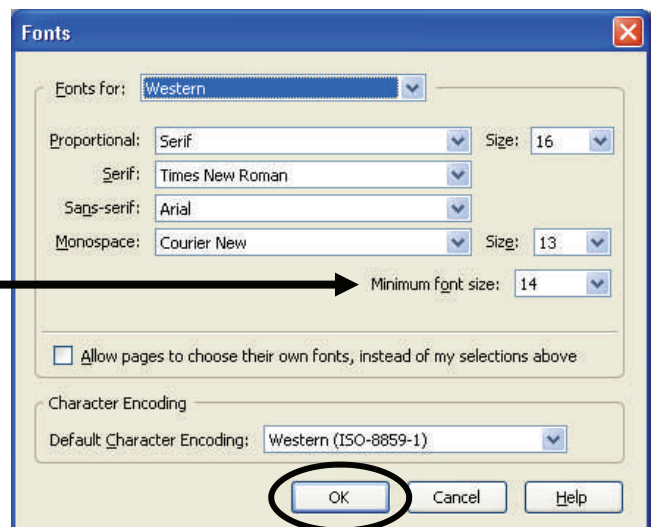
1. Open Firefox. From the navigation bar at the top, select Tools.



2. Select Options from the dropdown menu.
3. At the top of the Options window, select Content.
4. On the Content window, select the Advanced tab for Fonts & Colors.



5. On the Font window, select desired font size from the Minimum Font Size dropdown.
6. Click OK.

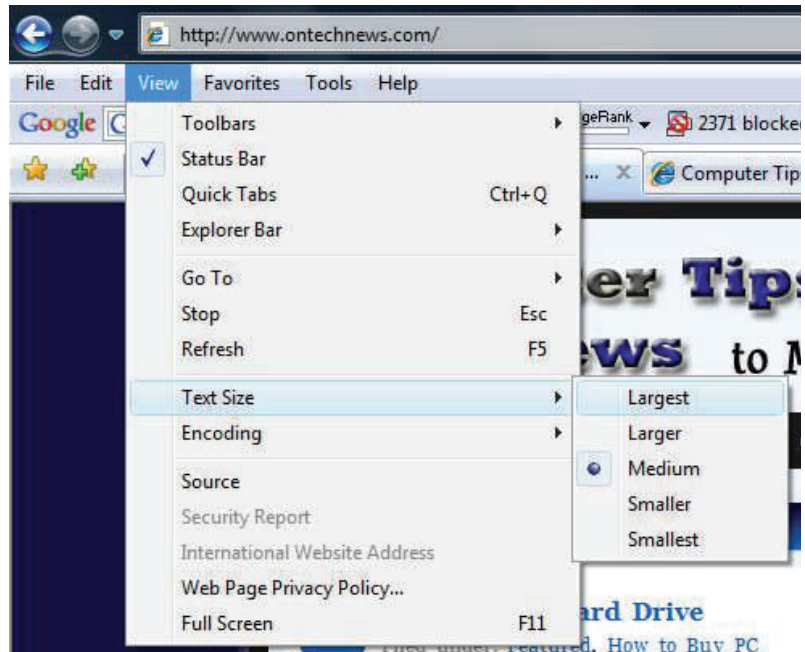




Internet Explorer

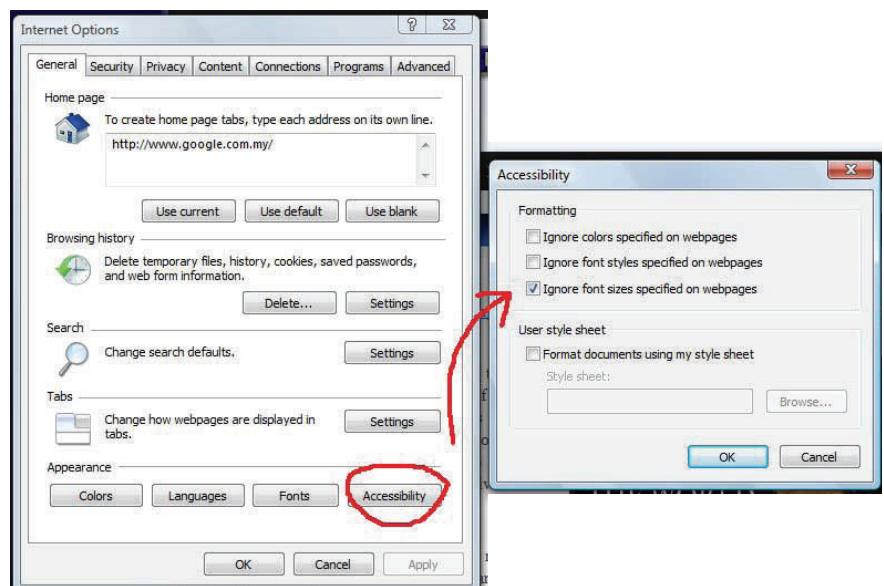
Changing website font size

1. Open Internet Explorer.
2. On the Internet Explorer menu bar, select View.
3. Select Text Size from the dropdown menu.
4. Select appropriate text size from list.



If the above method doesn't make any changes in some web pages, it means that the particular web pages do not meet the proper design guidelines and their font sizes are "hard-coded". In order to change font size of web pages that with "hard-coded" font size, you must override their font settings. To do so, follow the steps below:

- Open Internet Explorer as usual.
- Click on the "Tools" menu from the menu bar, then select "Internet Options".
- The "Internet Options" window will then pop up, click on the "Accessibility" button located at bottom right corner.
- In the "Accessibility" window, you can choose to:
- Ignore colors specified on Web pages.
- Ignore font styles specified on Web pages.
- Ignore font sizes specified on Web pages.





Safari

Changing website font size

1. Open Safari.
2. On the keyboard:
 - To increase the font size of a webpage, press Apple + Plus
[Remember the Plus key is Shift + Plus]
 - To decrease font size press Apple + Minus

Changing Website font size with your mouse.

If you have a wheel mouse you can use the wheel to alter the size of the text on most Web sites.



To do so, just hold down the [CTRL] key as you spin the button up and down. As you do the text will either increase or decrease depending on which way you move the wheel.
